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Dear Parents and Carers,

As you are aware, the situation regarding coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to evolve. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support during the early commencement of the Term 1 holidays.

The Victorian Government has now advised that all schools will move to remote and flexible learning when students return for Term 2 on **Wednesday 15 April**.

**This means that all students who can learn at home must learn from home.** This is a very clear directive by the Victorian Government **based on the advice of the Chief Health Officer**.

All students will be learning from home, except for children on days when they are not able to be supervised at home and no other arrangements can be made.

This is not an action being taken lightly, and I understand it may cause you and your family concern and stress. Please know this step is being taken to slow the spread of the virus and ensure the health and safety of all Victorians.

Most of our teachers will also be working from home. All of them have been working hard to put curriculum plans in place to ensure continuity of learning and to support the wellbeing of all our students.

Your messages regarding your needs have helped our planning enormously. **If you have not yet indicated via SMS if you believe you may require on-site care in term 2, please do so now.** (See the Flexibuzz post at the top of the feed for details).

**If you have indicated that you require on site attendance, you will be required to complete the attached On-Site Attendance Form by 3pm each Thursday prior to the week you require care. This must be done weekly as you must declare that you continue to be unable to supervise your child at home due to work, your child is well, and you will collect them immediately if they become unwell.** (I will send this information out in a separate message, with information about the first week).

Work is also underway to identify students who do not have access to digital technologies at home. Devices such as laptops and tablets will be made available on loan to these students free-of-charge to ensure no student misses out.

This is clearly going to be a challenging time for all of us. It's going to be critically important that we work very closely together to ensure that we provide the very best possible support for the ongoing wellbeing and learning of our students and your children.
