#### YEAR 3 CAMP

Last week, I had the pleasure of attending the Year 3 Camp in Airey's Inlet. We had a wonderful time participating in a range of activities across the three days and I am incredibly proud of the way our students represented our beautiful school.

On Wednesday, our students met their peers from Shelford, Meredith and Anakie Primary Schools in Bannockburn to board the bus to camp. We quickly began activities after the camp introductions and safety talk. The initial activities involved bravery and courage! The giant swing increased our heart rates, and the climbing wall took strength and patience. At the archery, students encouraged and congratulated each other on the points they gained. A quick evening walk up the hill behind the camp was an enjoyable experience to notice the sounds around camp. During day three, students packed their bags ready for our departure before enjoying more activities at the camp site. We completed the low ropes course and explored the camp site through a game of golf frisbee!
