2024 STUDENT BOOK PACKS

To prepare for 2024, families will soon be able to order their child's book pack through Kookaburra Educational Resources. All items ordered through Kookaburra by families will be individually packed and delivered directly to the school for the beginning of the school year. (NB: This method avoids postage costs for families). Lethbridge Primary School have worked hard with Kookaburra to offer a suitable pack of items tailored to your child's learning area at a very competitive price, whilst maintaining the quality of items supplied. You may choose to purchase these items elsewhere; however, we ask that you select the same items (brands & sizes) where possible and bring all items to school on the first day of the 2024 school year.

Information has been sent home with students regarding their book pack information for 2024.

HEALTH AND HYGIENE

While at school, students are supported with health and hygiene protocols such as using hand sanitiser. Throughout our learning spaces, we also have air purifiers and encourage ventilation through classrooms during the school day.

It is recommended that staff members, students or visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of symptomatic students will be contacted to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic.

The Department of Health recommends that staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 isolate for a minimum of 5 days and do not attend school until their symptoms resolve.

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff who:

- have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
- are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

At school, we have RATs available for families. Please speak with Meagan or Chelsey in the office if you would like to collect a packet.

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

There is an increased risk of seasonal asthma, hay fever and epidemic thunderstorm asthma during seasons with increased grass pollen levels. In Victoria, this is typically between October and December each year.

<u>Epidemic thunderstorm asthma</u> events are triggered by a combination of higher grass pollen levels and a certain type of thunderstorm.

People with a history of asthma, undiagnosed asthma or hay fever are at an increased risk under these conditions. This risk is increased further for people who have poorly treated hay fever and asthma.

The best way to reduce and prevent symptoms of asthma or hay fever and reduce unnecessary absences from school is to follow an up-to-date asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan, provided by a general practitioner (GP) or specialist.

If your child is affected, please ensure that the office has the most current management plan on file and current medication on hand.

STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Teachers and staff are always learning too! Last week, some of our teachers participated in Peer Observations. Peer observation is about teachers observing each others' practice and learning from one another. It aims to support the sharing of best practice and build awareness about the impact of individual teaching practice. Peer Observations are designed to provide an opportunity to learn from peers, create a professional learning community, promote student learning and participate in learning opportunities. During our Peer Observations last week, we visited Teesdale Primary School to learn about their literacy approach.

Professional Learning for staff always relates directly to our school goals, and these in turn always connect to the one reason we exist - our students!
